

GEELONG STATION UPGRADE PROJECT



The Geelong Train Station will receive a welcome upgrade following a \$3m investment from the Geelong City Deal.

The upgrade will elevate safety across the site as well as modernise certain features so that this historical site can cater to the needs of visitors and commuters well into the future.

Throughout the upgrade we will be working closely with the Wadawurrung Traditional Owners Aboriginal Corporation (WTOAC), Heritage Victoria and other local authorities to ensure that the integrity of the Geelong Train Station is maintained.

What's happening?

Lighting has been upgraded across the public areas to improve safety and reduce energy consumption by up to 50 per cent. CCTV cameras overseeing the Geelong station platform and waiting areas will be installed and upgraded.

A number of new passenger information displays, and four new myki fare payment devices will be placed throughout the station precinct.

We're working with WTOAC to acknowledge culture through the design of additional seating on the platforms and waiting areas, complementing existing heritage seating and providing more rest areas for

commuters. We're also working closely with Heritage Victoria to replace 13 skylights in the roof to let more natural light onto platform one.

When is this work happening?

Works commenced in 2021 and are expected to continue through to mid-2022. To minimise disruptions, most work will take place during off-peak times and a planned maintenance period.

The Geelong Train Station Upgrade Project is being delivered as part of the \$500 million Geelong City Deal, a collaborative plan to transform Geelong and the Great Ocean Road by the Australian and Victorian Governments, and the City of Greater Geelong through the Revitalising Central Geelong Action Plan.
